HOTELS/SHOWFIELD

- Holiday Inn guests may use the pool facilities for the duration of their stay, but we do ask parents to please be present in the pool areas when children are swimming.
- Golf carts are <u>for show staff use only</u> and we ask parents not to allow children to play on them or ride scooters on the show field. This is very much for <u>their</u> safety as cars are constantly moving in/out of the hotel lots.
- Truck/Trailer parking is located <u>ONLY</u> at the Nutter Center this year. Shuttle service and security will be provided.
- The show event schedule printed in this booklet will be displayed in the hotel lobby along with signs directing you to various locations where show functions are to be held.
- Security personnel and police officers will be patrolling the show grounds throughout the weekend with additional security added from 6:00 AM Friday through 6:00 PM Sunday. Please help them by securing valuables out of sight and keep your vehicles and trailers locked.
- Fairborn Police will be patrolling around the hotel area for the safety of participants and their property. Please drive responsibly on and around hotel property and while participating in show events.
- Burnouts, donuts, etc. done on show premises will result in your immediate dismissal from the show!
- A live DJ will play music and make important announcements throughout the weekend.
- The Holiday Inn will provide a car wash area for your convenience.
- The hotel restaurant will be open for breakfast/brunch and will be serving food outside during the afternoon/evening. Participants are welcome to bring their food inside to eat.
- <u>Glass bottles are not permitted in parking lots and all beverages must</u> <u>be either in plastic cups or cans</u>. Cans must be concealed in koozies.

REGISTRATION

- You likely received this booklet in Registration along with your window card, judging sheet, lanyards, etc. You MUST have your window card before going through Tech! Now is also an excellent time to complete the top portion of your judging sheet. Pre-registered cars will have a preprinted sticker. Please display your credentials at all times.
- If you do not wish to have your car judged, please let the registration staff know and you will be issued a green "Display Only" window card.
- You may elect to participate in the non-judged Work In Progress/Driver Class. Your car will still need to be teched.
- A concours class is open to 1967-1992 Firebirds. Participation in concours is voluntary. There is an *additional* fee of \$75 (above the standard show registration fee) for concours participants **Pre-registration only**!
- While you're in Registration, be sure to check out the following:
 - <u>Silent auction items</u> many of which are one-of-a-kind custom Firebird-themed goodies you will ONLY find here. Bid early and often as the money raised benefits A Special Wish Foundation, helping to make dreams come true for children with life-threatening illnesses.
 - There will also be a <u>50/50 drawing</u> held during the awards ceremony on Sunday. 50/50 tickets will be sold throughout the weekend so somebody will win some gas money for the trip home – might as well be YOU! The money raised through the 50/50 benefits A Special Wish Foundation.

Main** Street, Tipp City, OH 45371 as the destination address (this is the location of the registration tent). Awards given at 8:30 PM.

At 10:00 AM, there will be a judging seminar for participants. Details regarding the judging process will be covered in addition to discussion on what judges will be looking for. Participants will have the opportunity to ask questions and gain insight to improve their chances of winning. This seminar is very highly recommended for first-time participants.

At 11:00 AM, PHS-Online founder and President Jim Mattison will share a history of Pontiac personnel and how their leadership impacted Pontiac products. Following his GM career, Jim organized and cataloged the VIN of every Pontiac vehicle produced from 1955-1986, making them available to owners and enthusiasts for a very modest cost. Jim's services are an extremely important part of documenting and authenticating your vintage Pontiac!

- At 12:00 Noon, a very special seminar of GM Performance history will be presented in three parts: Past, present and future (1 hour each). This panel discussion, led by General Motors Executive Chief Engineer Brandon Vivian, will cover over 50 years of Pontiac performance and how Pontiac's spirit is still influencing GM performance models currently sitting in showrooms. Special Projects Engineer Herb Adams. Pontiac Studio II Design Chief John Schinella and Pontiac Designer Bill Davis will share their experience working on projects like Trans Am, SD-455, Fire Am and Silverbird.
- At 1:00 PM, our panel will be joined by Pontiac Public Relations and SLP Director Of Marketing Reggie Harris to discuss outside vendors like Cars & Concepts, PAS and SLP who were contracted by Pontiac to offer even higher performance versions of Pontiac Performance models. This portion of the presentation offers a fascinating insight into how these innovative Pontiac programs became the template still followed by automakers today.
- At 2:00 PM, our panel will address the rumor of Pontiac's return and discuss the future of performance models from General Motors, many with some surprising and very direct lineage to legendary Pontiac muscle. Pontiac may be gone, but there are still enthusiasts at GM creating cars they like to drive—here is your opportunity to hear about this effort straight from the source

TECH LINE

- After completing registration, you'll need to have your car teched.
- Your car does *not* need to be cleaned before going through Tech.
- The purpose of Tech is to count modifications beyond stock and class cars ٠ based on the number and/or type of modifications counted.
- A list of class definitions may be found on page 5 of this program \rightarrow •
- Firebirds are as unique as their owners, please be patient and understand that the job of tech is simply to group like cars with like cars.
- Participants with factory experimental, prototype or promotional cars/ options/accessories MUST be able to provide authentic documentation when requested by Tech Line staff.
- You will be assigned a class by the tech staff, please make sure your class ٠ is written on your window card and judging sheet.
- At this point, Nat's show parking staff will guide you to your class. All ٠ registered show cars MUST be parked in their class on Saturday and **Sunday**. No exceptions!
- Please do not add/delete parts or equipment on your car after you are classed and parked.
- If you feel you or a car in your class had been miss-classed, please bring it to the attention of the staff asap. Tech personnel will review protests on a case by case basis. Full cooperation of participants is greatly appreciated.
- Large displays, stuffed animals, trophies, etc. positioned around the cars are strongly discouraged due to space constraints. Follow a less-is-more approach and let the car be the star. Mirrors positioned to show undercarriages and tents/pop-ups are NOT allowed.
- Please be careful and courteous to your fellow participants when spraying waxes and protectants - especially if it's windy!
- No grills or cooking will be permitted on the show field.
- All show vehicles MUST be driven onto the show field under their own power. Tow vehicles & trailers must be parked at the Nutter Center.
- A 2024 T/A Nat's decal will be placed on your windshield to identify you as a participant and allow entry to the show grounds.
- ٠ You may come & go as you please, but you must have your window card and windshield sticker to gain access to the show field. Please leave your window card in your windshield at all times while on the show field.
- Please be courteous to our show Security staff. They are working around ٠ the clock throughout the weekend to keep you and your property safe.
- Please do not move cones and barricades. They are there to prevent unauthorized vehicles from entering show space.

2024 Trans Am Nationals Class Definitions

Stock Changes allowed in stock classes are limited to the following:

- Any stock appearing floor mats, or door handle inserts
- Any stock appearing aftermarket shifter
- The stock hood scoop made functional (opened up)
- Any Firebird/Trans Am wheels from the same model year, or valve stems
- Any aftermarket exhaust system (excluding headers) with stock appearing tips
- Any Firebird/Trans Am factory option from the same model year
- Most aftermarket stereos that fit without dash modifications, cb's, telephones, or radar detectors.
- Any stock type body side moldings
- Any factory type aftermarket replacement parts
- Any stock appearing window tints
- Parking stickers, permits, and club stickers
 <u>No other visible changes will be allowed in any of the stock classes</u>!

<u>Modified</u>: Allows 1 - 5 changes <u>Heavy Modified</u>: Allows 6 - 10 changes <u>Custom</u>: Allows 11 - 15 changes and/or:

- Any mild custom paint (including a non-factory available color)
- Any radical upholstery changes
- Any audio system that includes a major interior modification
- Any mild but non-stock appearing emblems or birds

Heavy Custom: Allows 16 or more changes, or any of the following:

- Any radical custom emblems, birds, or paint
- Any body modifications (blending in of seams, etc.)
- Any engine not available on that model year
- Any roll cages

Super Street: with any of the following equipment:

- Any aftermarket blower, turbo, tunnel ram, etc.
- Any nitrous oxide systems
- Tubbed

SE 1/SE 2: Limited & Special Edition T/A's Stock/Modified Firehawk/Comp T/A: All F-Body Types, All Years Non-Factory Production: Fitchbird, Fire-Am, Macho, MSE, TAS Bandit Work In Progress/Driver: All Types, all years (non-judged class) Concours: Any stock or modified 1967-1992 Firebird may enter

- Please consider attending the <u>participant judging seminar at 10:00</u> <u>AM on Saturday</u> in the Holiday Inn Ballroom. There will be lots of information presented with plenty of opportunities to ask questions.
- When your car is ready to be judged, <u>please place your judging</u> <u>sheet on the left-hand side of your dashboard with the top portion</u> completed (or pre-printed label applied (pre-registered ONLY)).
- You may have your car judged anytime between 10:00AM 3:30PM Saturday and 9:00AM Noon on Sunday.
- Those wishing to participate in the Tipp City Show n' Shine are strongly encouraged to have their judging sheets completed and on their dashboard as early as possible Saturday.
- Every effort will be made to complete Saturday judging. Please understand that our judges face many factors which cannot be controlled. Your patience is appreciated.
- Please listen carefully to the DJ for any announcements regarding judging, especially in case of rain where cars will need to be closed up during the judging process.
- Judges are not to touch participants' cars without permission.
- The judges will place a sticker on your window card once your car is judged. The sticker simply indicates the car has been judged.
- All cars in judged classes must be displayed <u>both Saturday and</u> <u>Sunday</u>, *regardless of when they are judged*, to be eligible for awards. A second sticker will be applied to verify.
- If you need to leave prior to awards Sunday and/or cannot display your car both days, please let our judging staff know.
- The award presentation will begin at approximately 3:00 PM in the Holiday Inn Ballroom. Security will remain on show field.
- All decisions pertaining to awards are final.
- Participants may request a .pdf copy by emailing their name, car number and class to: <u>cheryl@tacadcinc.com</u> between 9/1/24 and 10/31/24. Do not post individual results on social media.
- Any concerns/comments pertaining to the show/judging may also be sent to jerry@tacadcinc.com. ALL issues sent through email will be reviewed by show committee. Those posted on social media may not. If you have any issues, please send a personal message.
